General eligibility criteria for applicants

- a) The applicant shall possess
 - PhD / Master's degree / Bachelor's degree from a recognized University or Institution in Chemistry or Biochemistry or Food Technology or Food Science & Technology or Food & Nutrition or Edible Oil Technology or Microbiology or Dairy Technology or Agricultural or Horticultural Sciences or Industrial Microbiology or Toxicology or Public Health or Life Science or Biotechnology or Fruit & Vegetable Technology or Food Safety & Quality Assurance or Food Processing Technology or Fruit & Vegetable or Medicine or Veterinary sciences or Fisheries or Animal Sciences.
 - Minimum fifteen years of experience in research institutions or scientific organizations laboratories in a supervisory capacity in any of the aforesaid subjects / areas.
- b) Persons with industry experience and having worked in private sector can also apply, provided they have a minimum of fifteen years of experience in Industrial R&D centers, QA and/or regulatory compliance in food industries, and have retired from the service in food industry at least two years prior to the date of applying.
- c) Any individual who has served two or more terms in the same SP shall not be considered for the membership of that SP. Further, any individual who has served more than three terms across different SPs or is above 70 years of age are not eligible. Such members may apply for independent membership of the SC, the upper age limit will still remain as 70 years only.

Verification of eligibility of applicants

- d) The verification process shall be carried out by the Secretariat of the SSC.
- e) The application received after the last day / deadline shall not be considered. Further, the application shall meet the requirements set out therein for necessary consideration.

Evaluation of eligible candidates

- f) The eligible candidates will further be evaluated on the basis of the selection criteria provided in *Annexure 1*.
- g) A Search cum Selection Committee (SSC), comprising members who are previous Chairpersons of the SC not below the rank of DDG (serving / retired) or Vice Chancellors of universities associated to SC/SPs or Presidents of national academies (serving/retired) at the rank of DDG and above or Chairpersons of State Science & Technology academies or Directors of national institutes not below the rank of Additional Secretary / DDG.
- h) The SSC shall determine / arrive at a cut-off score so as to consider the suitable candidates for membership in SC / SP. In any case, an applicant has to score at least a minimum of 500 marks to be placed in the zone of consideration for being shortlisted.
- i) SSC shall have the discretion to recommend eminent experts / scientists / technologists for inclusion into the SP / SC. Such inclusion can be made with reasons to be recorded in writing.

- j) SSC shall shortlist the names for the SC & SP's in the order of merit and submit a report with a list indicating shortlisted & recommended candidates.
- k) These candidates are required to submit necessary declarations as specified in the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (Transaction of Business and Procedure for the Scientific Committee and Scientific Panel) Regulations, 2016 and its amendments therein. These declarations shall be reviewed by the Secretariat and the validated candidate would be proposed for further appointment.
- 1) Upon approval of the proposal by the Food Authority (FA), the Secretariat supporting the relevant SP or the SC will contact the experts to notify their appointment and invite them for the first plenary meeting of the relevant body.

SOP of SC & SP

m) Members selected for the SC and SPs would need to undertake periodic visits to FSSAI, New Delhi where the meetings are normally held and shall have a commitment to devote time & resources for the deliberations in the meetings. The Food Authority has notified the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (Transaction of Business and Procedures for the Scientific Committee and Scientific Panels) Regulations, 2016 that specifies the modus operandi in which the SC & SPs would work.

- n) The candidates applying for the membership of SP's/SC shall not be "holding a position or having a membership or associated with direct or indirect pecuniary or material benefit with any associations, private institutions/organization, consultancy agencies, professional bodies, NGO's running through private stakeholders or representing communities, who are involved in food businesses or facilitator of food business".
- o) The selected candidates are required to submit necessary declarations as specified in the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (Transaction of Business and Procedure for the Scientific Committee and Scientific Panel) Regulations, 2016 and its amendments therein.
